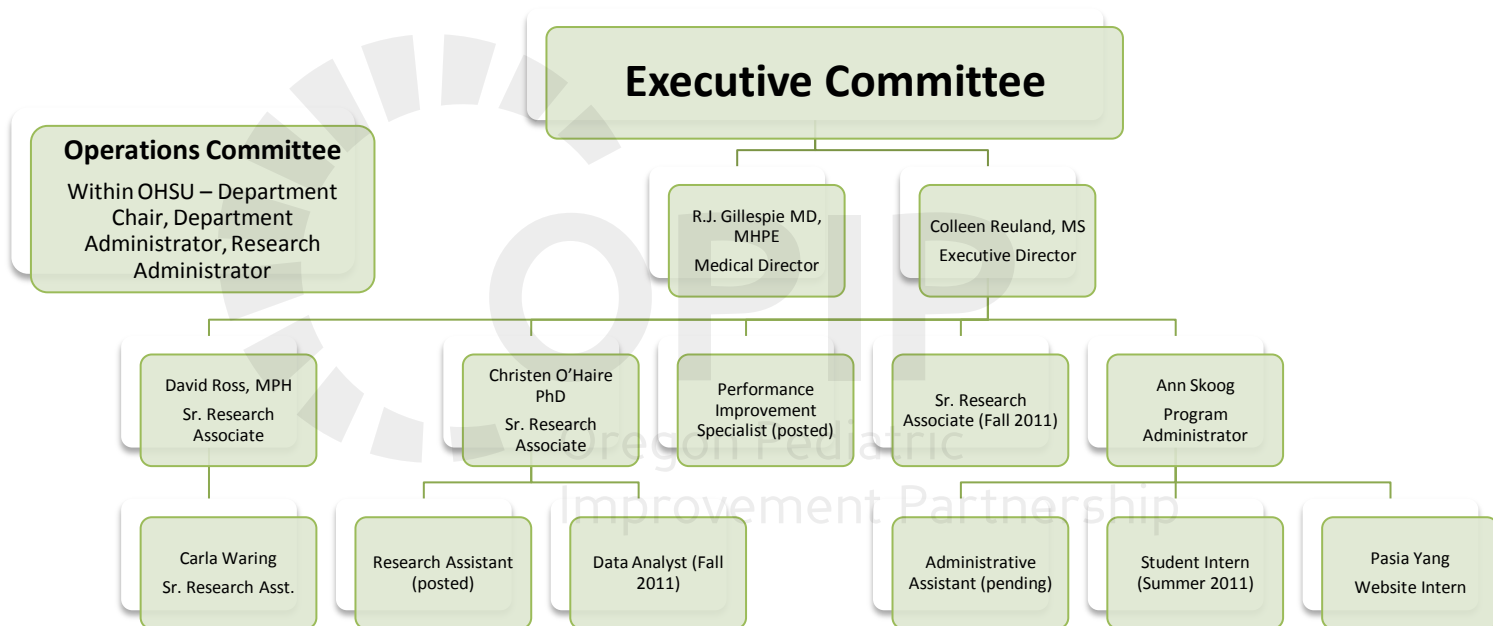
# Organizational Chart

# Empowering our Partners

- Our founding partners now our Executive Committee
- Monthly meetings well-attended
- Functioning as a Board of Directors that review and give input for project work, strategic direction, state committee activities
- Members include: Children's Health Alliance, Oregon Pediatric Society, CAHMI, Medicaid, Public Health, OHSU, OCCYSHN, Family Voices, Oregon Academy of Family Physicians

# ABCD III

## *OPIP's first contract*

- Focus of project is improving care coordination for children at risk for developmental delays
- Unique approach in Oregon – utilize Medicaid Performance Improvement Project requirements
- OPIP facilitating a learning collaborative of eight of the Medicaid Managed Care Organizations, covering multiple counties in the state



# ABCD III

## *Four pillars of QI project*

- Screening for potential delays
- Referral to Early Intervention
- Completion of EI evaluation
- Communication back to PCP

# Tapping into the Medicaid Match

## *Expanding scope and scale of project*

- Original grant to Medicaid
- As an EQR-like entity within a public institution, matching funds allowed for marked increase in final contract amount
- Allows for infrastructure build, greater impact of project

# A Learning Collaborative of MCOs

*Aligning and leveraging needs of our partners*

- Medicaid required to conduct Performance Improvement Projects (PIP)
- Health plans also providing care coordination services for some patients
- If care coordination for children at risk is a problem, how can the care coordinators already embedded in health plans play a role?

# Community Café Process

## *Engaging parents in Quality Improvement*

- Serves as one of the foundations of the QI project
- Parents from each community recruited to participate in an informal conversation anchored to the project goals
- As the café is parent-only, able to share thoughts in a safe environment

# Community Provider Engagement

## *Part of Baseline Assessment*

- Strategic interviews in each of the counties affected by ABCD III
  - Providers
  - EI contractors
  - Health plan contacts
  - Other community agencies
- Asked about current state of affairs, where is the current interest and passion, what changes would be most helpful
- Stage 3 engagement brings parents with these providers to assimilate information from Community Café and Strategic Interviews

# CHIPRA

## *Other “work in progress” innovations*

- Working on two components – Medical Home Measurement and Learning Collaborative
- Development of Medical Home Measures Database
- Partner engagement in the development of CHIPRA Learning Collaborative contract
