



# Learning Collaborative for Integrated Behavioral Health in Primary Care: Strategies and Tools to Provide Assessments and Brief Interventions for Young Children Addressing Social Emotional Health

Primary care plays a critical role in a young child’s life, with over a dozen visits recommended before starting Kindergarten. These visits provide opportunities for assessments and interventions in primary care to address early signs of delays in **social-emotional health** that can impact a child’s well-being and readiness for kindergarten. An **incentive metric for Coordinated Care Organizations (CCO)** is focused on the provision of these services and improving the rates of services provided to young children in a variety of settings, including primary care.

Building off previous work with primary care sites, the **Oregon Pediatric Improvement Partnership (OPIP)** is kicking off a **multi-year learning collaborative** for primary care sites to **provide trainings and tools** that can improve how integrated behavioral health provide issue-focused services for young children. The Learning Collaborative is funded by Health Share of Oregon with the **objective** to *enhance Integrated Behavioral Health Clinicians’ understanding of Oregon’s Social- Emotional Health quality metric and of opportunities, tools, and strategies to provide assessments and brief interventions in the medical home that meet the social- emotional needs of young children.*

**Who is invited to attend?** The Learning Collaborative is open to Integrated Behavioral Health Clinicians (attesting to PCPCH Standard 3.C.3) who are in a primary care site that:

- Contract with one or more of the health plan partners within **Health Share of Oregon** and:
- Are wanting to receive training to enhance provision of services to young children, including assessments, brief intervention, and/or best match connections to specialty behavioral health.

**When are the Learning Collaborative Events and What Topics Will be Covered?** The Learning Collaborative will offer both virtual and in-person learning formats, with multiple time slots offered to increase feasibility for attendance.
