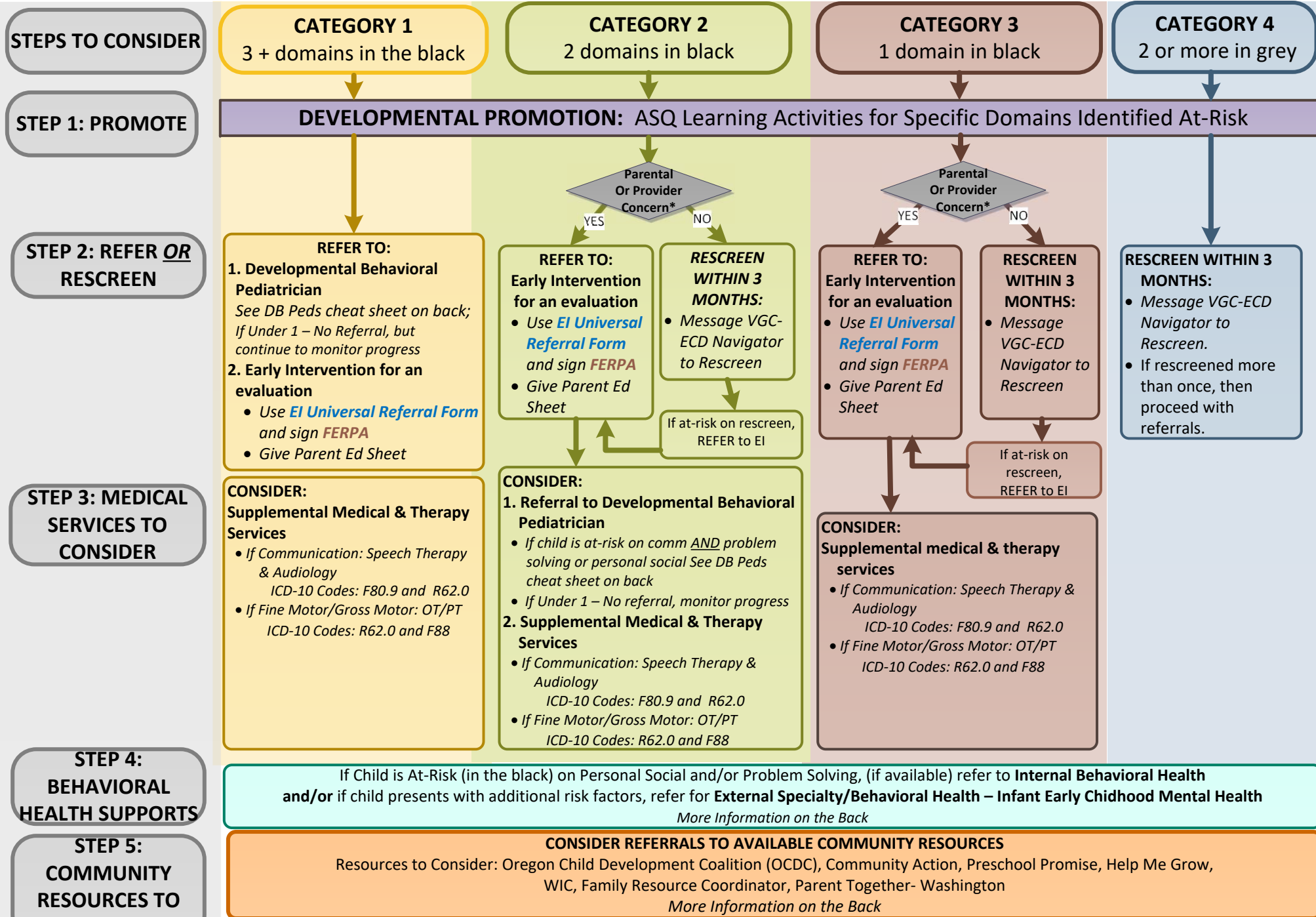

CONSIDER:

- Referral to Developmental Behavioral Pediatrician**
 - If child is at-risk on comm **AND** problem solving or personal social See DB Peds cheat sheet on back
 - If Under 1 – No referral, monitor progress
- Supplemental Medical & Therapy Services**
 - If Communication: Speech Therapy & Audiology
ICD-10 Codes: F80.9 and R62.0
 - If Fine Motor/Gross Motor: OT/PT
ICD-10 Codes: R62.0 and F88

RESCREEN WITHIN 3 MONTHS:

- Message VGC-ECD Navigator to Rescreen

If at-risk on rescreen, REFER to EI

CONSIDER: Supplemental medical & therapy services

- If Communication: Speech Therapy & Audiology
ICD-10 Codes: F80.9 and R62.0
- If Fine Motor/Gross Motor: OT/PT
ICD-10 Codes: R62.0 and F88

RESCREEN WITHIN 3 MONTHS:

- Message VGC-ECD Navigator to Rescreen.
- If rescreened more than once, then proceed with referrals.

If Child is At-Risk (in the black) on Personal Social and/or Problem Solving, (if available) refer to **Internal Behavioral Health** and/or if child presents with additional risk factors, refer for **External Specialty/Behavioral Health – Infant Early Childhood Mental Health**

* One example of when a provider should be concerned is if a child is well-below the cut-off in the domain(s).

Developmental Pediatrician Referral Cheat Sheet:

Kid in the **BLACK** on the Communication domain

+

Personal-Social domain or Problem Solving Domain

or

If the child is 'In the BLACK' on 2 or more domains and has any of the following presenting concerns:

- Kids who are not progressing in services as expected or recent increase in symptoms
- Kids who have challenging behaviors with inadequate response to behavioral interventions or medication.
- Kids with secondary medical issues that are not responding to usual treatments (including feeding and nutrition)
- Kids who may be experiencing traumatic events

Help me Grow

- Supports families with getting OHP
- Connects to In Home parenting support like Healthy Families and Nurse Family partnership (families must enroll prenatally or within the first three months)
- Parenting resource packet
- Connection to community programs like WIC

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

- Provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support, healthy food, health referrals, and other services free of charge to families who qualify and can be connected through Help Me Grow.

Preschool Promise

- The Preschool Promise Program is a publicly funded, preschool program for children ages three (3) and four (4) in families living at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, children in foster care, and children from historically underserved populations.

If child is "in black" on **Personal Social and Problem Solving**

If child is "in black" on **Personal Social and Problem Solving**

+

Concerns such as **oppositional, aggressive, overactive or shy/anxious behaviors, significant sleep, feeding, self-soothing, adjusting to new situations, or irritability concerns**

And/Or

Exposure to **Adverse Childhood Experiences** <https://www.samhsa.gov>

Option A:

Internal Behavioral Health referral. Example of follow-up steps by IBH staff.

- **Assessment**
- **Potential additional screenings as part of Assessment**
- **Brief Interventions**
- **If applicable, engagement on external referral**

Option B:

Consider External Referral for Specialty Behavioral Health – Infant Early Childhood Mental Health (Send a message to the VGC-ECD Navigator)
