



FREE Learning Opportunity for Primary Care-based **Integrated Behavioral Health Clinicians!** Learning Curriculum Focused on Brief Interventions for Young Children Addressing Common Behavioral Concerns



Eastern Oregon Coordinated Care Organization (EOCCO) is supporting the **Oregon Pediatric Improvement Partnership (OPIP)** to provide a free learning curriculum designed to strengthen integrated behavioral health clinicians' ability to provide brief interventions for young children addressing common behavioral health concerns. OPIP has extensive experience in implementing this Learning Curriculum, which yielded measurable improvements in attendees' knowledge and comfort seeing young children, including with clinicians in rural communities. The curriculum support services aligned with the Young Children Receiving Social-Emotional Issue-Focused Interventions **Coordinated Care Organization quality metric**. Developed in collaboration with **Andrew Riley, PhD**, an expert in primary-care based services for children, the curriculum provides practical, evidence-based brief intervention strategies that clinicians can incorporate into everyday practice.

Who Can Participate? This opportunity is for behavioral health clinicians who:

- Work at an EOCCO-contracted primary care clinic. The curriculum is geared towards integrated behavioral health in primary care but may be applicable for other settings.
- Currently provide services for children birth to five or plan to.
- **Continuing Education/CME will be available** for each learning opportunity.



What is Included in the Learning Curriculum:

- **One In-Person Learning Session** to be held in late Fall. The date and location will be determined by responses to the **registration survey**. Food provided. EOCCO will cover travel costs. Attendees will also be entered into a raffle to win a gift card.
- **Four Interactive Webinars** focused on common behavioral health concerns and practical brief intervention strategies. Topic examples include disruptive behaviors, sleep issues, time outs, toilet training, and anxiety.
